THE CALL for PEACE AND PROSPERITY

A military is an organization that has one purpose - to win wars for its sovereign. Without a military, a sovereign cannot exist. Since the beginning of human existence, there had been trifle conflicts between two patriarchs of equals who called for the arms of his brothers, which grew into family feuds, which then grew into tribal conflicts, and ending up as modern global warfare for land and resources, religion, greed, oil or ambitions to be a sovereign.

A sovereign, using the military, forced men to abide by man-made rules or risked heavy persecution. Men, who refused to be drafted into the military or disobey the wills of their sovereign because of religious beliefs or ideology, were burdened with excessive taxes, charged with blasphemy, disturbing the peace, disorderly behavior, and contempt of court. Many were sentenced to a whipping. Their goods and property were confiscated and are condemned to search for better places to live but some are locked up in jail like Henry David Thoreau. Men, such as the Quakers who advocated for world peace, were also beaten, feathered, hung, beheaded or shot by their fellow Christian brethren as a public display ordered by a sovereign of England, Charles I. All this cruelty was necessary to keep a military intact and unhindered by the philosophical views of generations of widows and scholars since ancient times.

As countless history examples had shown, when two sovereigns gain enough power for a hostile takeover, the military forces prove devastating for mankind, according to Thucydides's book 'History of the Peloponnesian War (423-403 BC).' Women and children were enslaved, raped or killed. Villages and cities were pillaged and chaos ensued for further killings of neighboring sovereignties.

A sovereign's man-made rules, whether implicit or explicit, were coded to the "customs" of a culture over time, especially military customs where such rules flourished.

The U.S. military customs have its roots for hundreds of years since its beginning. Tories were persecuted in the same manner like the Quakers. Men were drafted in the military to serve the deeds of its sovereign regardless of the cause. Men were forced to obey orders by ways of punishments, fines, or imprisonments. Even a military of a proclaimed "democratic institution" was not run by democratic ideology. Reasoning was a danger to mindless obedience required by a sovereign because questioning the authority of a sovereign endangers the discipline of his man-made "rules" and especially, his military.

In many nations since ancient times, such "military, rules and orders" kept the institution of slavery for hundreds of years, through wholesale slaughter of aborigines and genocide as evident by the most notorious modern sovereign, Adolf Hitler of Germany.

Martin Luther King, with his brothers and sisters in a peaceful protest for civil rights, was hosed by a National Guard regiment as ordered by a sovereign of a so called democratic institution. Indeed, time after time, sovereigns had used state sponsored terrorism on its citizenry to maintain the status quo.

Thus, to be an effective military leader, one must imitate the ways of the sovereign by subjugating otherwise inherently equal human-beings into "subordinates" by the ways of the "chain-of-command". Men, who refused to be subordinates, faced fines, imprisonment, or other state sponsored persecution and terrorism.

Therefore, insubordination is considered "bad" according to the man-made rules and orders of a sovereign. There will never be peace in the world as long as two humans disagree on a subject. Even within a military organization, two humans disagreeing on a trifle subject could cause stability concerns of the institution. For example, within the United States' military, there is a customary set of orders called the "Uniform Code of Military Justice", which has less to do with justice than to minimize disagreements between

military individuals. Usually, the senior ranking individual wins the argument by default. To argue or reason with a senior ranking person meant "disrespect", a loose term subjected to individual and bias interpretation.

In the military, "disrespect" was and is still widely used as a wildcard to seek punishment for enlisted soldiers. In the old days, grown men were whipped, flogged, or "ordered" to do inhumane tasks. This of course, has been to a lesser degree since the era of civil rights. Punishment, torture, and inhumane treatment like those worked miracles for Saddam and his henchman, mindless brainwashed individuals corrupted by the influences of a sovereign.

Many humans, like ants, die for worthless causes or killed by worthless humans with worthless causes. I'd too pray for the safety and well being of servicemembers like Spc. Shoshana Johnson or Pfc. Jessica Lynch. Why were they ever placed in a danger zone? Why was anyone placed in danger at all? There are domestic, criminal activities that worried me more than any threat from a foreign nation. Even the crisis of the homeless issue worries me more than to have wars against other states for the purpose of securing our "safety" or rather, oil supplies to enrich the patronage of the sovereign.

Most people realize that billions of American taxpayers' dollars are spent on waste, fraud and abuse. The sovereign is embezzling our prosperity for what amounts to endless killing sprees of mainly innocent men, women, and child in third world countries. For the benefits of mankind, there should be only one sovereign, a democratic world governing body institution exemplified by the United Nations which had kept the peace we enjoyed for decades, reinforced ballistic missile treaties and the codes of the Geneva Convention. It may not be the most powerful institution, that but it serves to minimize an outlaw individual sovereign with power hunger to act on his "guts". When a sovereign act on his "guts", lawlessness was ensued and military organizations mobilized into a state of "war" and conformity and mindless obedience must be maintained at all levels of the "chain-of-command" for missions that include murderous, deadly and inhumane atmospheres.

In the military, nonconformity to the "guts" of a sovereign and his imitator might mean mutiny, a crime punishable by death. That is why it is important for subordinates to obey orders in the military or be dragged away by the military police that reinforces the "guts" of the sovereign throughout the military organization. To lie to your "superiors" is considered "disrespect", but not necessarily vice-versa. All military personnel, regardless of rank, are lied to by their superiors, given rhetoric like "the enemy is desperate, that's why they are increasingly their attacks on us to ward off the happiness we bring to their people" or "continued violence might stall the removal of troops" or "we are bringing democracy to them."

True democracy has never been a foundation in any history of mankind. The nearest to a democracy was the Athenians, whose democracy excluded women, slaves and children. Those patriarch men comprised a sovereign, spent the majority of their public daily activities in political affairs -- every vote-able men were politicians. To say we're bringing democracy to a group of people is to make them into politicians with powers. But that was never the real intention of a conquering sovereign willing to plunder the wealth of a country with missiles, bombs and an invasion of wooden men, manipulated by their sovereign to do evil deeds if must. The sovereign of the U.S. is not the citizenry -- it is a far cry from democracy and resembles a dictatorship in every essence of the word.

In the media, military journalists are suppose to sugar coat the foul plays of war, to make troops feel like they are dying for a worthy cause to protect their love ones back home who are currently are being snuffed everyday by domestic violence, rising crimes, traffic accidents, poverty, poor health care and other non-foreign terrorist related incidents. The U.S. has the highest crime rate for a modernized nation. A marine, received a purple heart for his injury in the war with Iraq, was fatally shot, possibly by a gangster when he returned

home to celebrate his homecoming. That marine's fight in Iraq for the "safety" of his country was not won, neither were fellow servicemember suicides helped. The average neighboring thugs at that marine's home were more threatening to him, his family and love ones. And who can recount the recent stories of servicemembers who returned home from the war in Afghanistan and murdered their spouse.

Photos of dead servicemembers or any war casualties were best left unknown as one senator had expressed "the improvements (of oil facilities) made in Iraq are worth more than few dead soldiers in the media." That was clearly one of many indications which government officials do not represent the people at all. So who can blame if democracy cannot and will not exist in Iraq?

Honestly, war is a terrible event with a terrible price that no sovereign cares for. Otherwise, there wouldn't be any wars. The sovereign enjoys himself in his country ranch while the military performs all his dirty deeds.

Some people asked, why not use the nuclear bombs like in Hiroshima to eliminate the people in one swift action so reconstruction would be easier? These quotes are just too mean to be in the media. Can I truly be honest and tell my superiors what I think without harassment, yelling and other persecution measures inherent in a military? And how wise can a person be allowed before wisdom and reasons become threats to the hierarchy.

To this day, many people have forgotten the dreams of Martin Luther King and the virtues of Henry David Thoreau's no-taxation-without-representation. They were Christians who resisted the temptations of sovereigns and understood the wisdom of "Thou shall not kill."

God sent me a message of love. He asked what love I have for this country. I told God that a military ordered me to protect this country. But God said he is greater than any sovereign, government or military and told me to love and to give love to all people, which will protect all who follow his guidance.
